Tre'Shawn recently got married and is currently living in Talbot County with her husband and their pup! She looks forward to seeing what Habitat has in store next for the community!




New Hires: Meet Michael

An Interview with Homebuyer Coach Cindy Lilley

Cindy Lilley has volunteered with Habitat Choptank as a homebuyer coach since 2005!

In this interview, Cindy shares her experience as a homebuyer coach and encourages volunteers to consider serving as a homebuyer coach!

Why did you decide to become a homebuyer coach?

I retired from 30 years of teaching and moved to Easton so I was looking for volunteer opportunities that connected with people. I observed the Homebuyer Selection and Partnership committees to see what Habitat was about and then decided to try coaching and have been coaching since 2005!

What are your favorite parts about volunteering as a coach?

Working 1:1 with homebuyer partner families and coaching them through the Habitat process to purchase a home. I have so much respect for the people that enter the Habitat program. They work the sweat equity, attend required education sessions, save their money and more, all while working one or two jobs and raising their children. I also enjoy the camaraderie of all the coaches we experience at our monthly meetings.

How have you grown or what have you learned through volunteering as a coach?

I have learned that people who have never owned a home or been able to buy a home can accomplish home ownership with commitment and hard work. I also have learned that Habitat builds very high quality energy efficient homes. I'm impressed with the multiple organizations that work cooperatively with Habitat to provide support and resources to our homebuyers. Our education program brings in speakers from a wide variety of other nonprofits to share information on their services.

Why should volunteers consider becoming homebuyer coaches?

People should consider becoming coaches if they think they will like mentoring an adult who is eager and committed to buying a home for their family. Habitat provides very clear guidelines and support for coaches. Coaches track sweat equity and education hours required to purchase a home and sometimes work along side the person they are coaching. Coaches all have individual styles of coaching so there is lots of flexibility in this type of volunteering.
